**\* Abstract Submission:**

Each abstract must be submitted by the person who is going to make the oral or poster presentation in the Workshop. Abstracts, written in MS Word software, should be electronic mailed as an attached file to Dr. Sangheon Yi ([shyi@kigam.re.kr](mailto:shyi@kigam.re.kr)) no later than **August 31 (thu), 2006**. Accepted abstracts will be published in the abstract volume, which will be distributed to all participants.

**\*\* Format of abstracts**

**MS Word** software is desirable. Abstract is limited to two A4 pages in length, and figures or tables are acceptable. **General layout:** Top, bottom, left and right margins are 35, 30, 25 and 25 mm, respectively. **Title:** Upper and lower case, left adjust. Times, 14pt bold. **Contributors' name:** Type in all caps, left adjust. Times, 11pt. **Affiliation:** Upper and lower case, left adjust, and occupying a single line. Times, 10pt italic. Numbered superscripts should be used to indicate the affiliation of each contributor. E-mail address can be added in parenthesis, at the end of the corresponding contributor's affiliation. **Main text:** Single-spaced text using Times, 10pt. If section headings are used, type in all caps using Times, 10pt bold, left adjust. If subsection headings are used, type using Times, 10pt bold, upper and lower case, left adjust.

**\*\* Orals**

The recommended oral presentation format for the Workshop is to use MS Power Point software, linked to a multimedia projector. For the PC-based presentation you will be able to either use your own laptop or download your file on the Workshop computer. Please remember that you have a total **20 minutes** for your presentation (15 minutes for the talk and 5 minutes for Questions & Answers). In order to keep the Workshop on schedule and to smoothly manage the transfer between parallel sessions - this time will be strictly enforced by the Session Chairs. Details will be announced by the Session Chair during the Workshop.

**\*\* Posters**

Posters have to be prepared to fit a panel with the following dimensions: **84.1 cm (broad) × 118.9 cm (high) (A0 size)**. Please remember to use a font size that can be legible from approximately 1 m distance. Supplies to mount your posters will be provided on site. You will have a total of two days to keep your poster at the board. Each delegates will be allocated times to present their posters.
